Soaring to new heights and setting their sights on new horizons, has seen a group of our HGFA pilots achieve an Australian-first feat for the sport of paramotoring.

In the country's longest paramotor climb, our six skilled pilots, recently flew more than 1600km from the lowest point of the country at Lake Eyre (49ft below sea level) to the highest point of the snow-capped crest of Mount Kosciuszko (7310ft above sea level).



A big congratulations go to Andrew Polidano of Ballina, Justin Shaw and Peter Forbes of Bendigo, Dr Peter Evans of Canberra, Brendan Tacey of Whittlesea, Christopher Farney of Kilmore and driver, Carl Norton from Longwood Victoria, who achieved this amazing milestone for the sport, showcasing the incredible capabilities of their aircraft, while cementing their place in the history books.

The boys braved the wild weather of the Antarctic blast and turbulent thermal gusts to reach ground speeds of up to 100km/hr, over the two-week expedition.
