In accordance with Section 11.3(g)(ii) of the SAFA Constitution (2019), the following members have been appointed by their Regional Associations as their Affiliate Directors, in accordance with their Regional Associations' Constitutions:

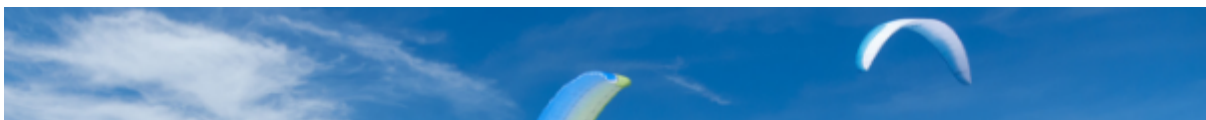
Paul Green (Qld South)

At the close of nominations, there were therefore two vacant Elected Director positions and the Affiliate Director positions for W.A. and Qld North.

There being less nominations received than members to be elected, in accordance with Sections 11.4(b)(iii) and 11.5(b)(ii) a ballot is not required for 2019. However, the time line established for the process will be followed. The ballot was due to be concluded and the results declared on Wednesday 18 December 2019. This will still be the case.

The transition of powers to the new Board of Directors will occur on Friday 10 January 2020. The Company Secretary will schedule a meeting of the Directors on or after Saturday 1st February 2020. At that point, in accordance with Sections 11.7(b) and 11.7(c) of the SAFA Constitution, measures will be taken to fill the vacant Director positions.
